

### What is a canopy tree?

*Canopy Tree.* Any tree indigenous to the state of Florida that grows to a minimum height of forty (40) feet and provides a thirty-foot radius of shade at full maturation. Canopy trees are known for their height and broad canopies. They provide shade.

Each single-family lot will be required to have one (1) canopy tree with a DBH planting of at least three (3) inches.

### What is an understory tree?

*Understory Tree.* Any indigenous tree to the state of Florida that is not a canopy tree but grows to a minimum height of fifteen (15) feet. Understory trees are smaller than canopy trees. They can survive below a canopy tree; they are shade tolerant.

Each single-family lot will be required to have two (2) understory trees each with a DBH at planting of at least two (2) inches.
